First Winter: Washington and His Army in Morristown, 1777, provides a compelling view into the heart of the American Revolution and Morristown's critical involvement in the war and the success of America's independence.

The Morristown Green was a vital point in the American War for Independence. Washington made his headquarters in the Arnold Tavern on the Green in the winter of 1777, arriving in Morristown immediately after the American victories at Trenton and Princeton.

Military detachments remained at the nearby fort, misnamed "Non-sense", throughout the war guarding munitions stored in buildings facing the Green. Washington himself was in Morristown four times during the Revolution; it has been conjectured that he spent more days there than in any one place during the war.
